Seeds of plants you like, such as disease resistant pumpkins or heirloom squash Reused ice bucket for kitchen compost container

Orchard mason bee house (make one or buy one for more money)

Seed keeper: make a binder with 3hole-punched plastic ziplock bags to store seeds Rain garden how-to publications from UW Extension, WI DNR, or Dane County Set of reused 5 gal plastic pails with handles for hauling tools, weeds, mulch, etc Re-gift good quality tools you no longer use

Birds of Wisconsin placemat

Hand balm or lotion such as Badger Balm or a cranberry based lotion

"Pesticide free zone" sign made of metal with large ladybug image, or safe lawn sign

Amaryllis bulb in a pot or tulip, hyacinth, and narcissus bulbs for indoors

Double hose connector so one faucet can handle two hoses

Organic or local maple syrup, honey or jams

Good quality tape measure

Polypropylene floating row cover for vegetables, or nylon net trellis for vegetables Soil knife for weeding and transplanting

Garden gloves: lots of new fabrics and types available

Hanging pocket shoe organizer for tools, gloves, seeds

Stainless steel compost pail for kitchen counter

Water siphons or other system for indoor plant watering while you are away

Bat house (build it yourself from plans or buy one, for a more expensive gift)

Noodlehead flexible sprinkler to target water only where you need it

Wide brimmed hat for sun protection

Rural mailbox mounted on post in yard to store extra set of gloves and trowel

LED headlamp for gardening at night

Fresh local organic produce or gift certificate to restaurant that serves local produce

Set of "Growing _____(salad greens, tomatoes, etc) in WI" Extension publications

A string of LED lights to decorate your house using 90% less heat and energy

Floral arrangement coil, or "frogs"
